INSTRUCTION TO STEWARDS

The Appointed Stewards shall attend the reception, classification and placing of all exhibits, wait upon the judges and afford them the information necessary for the discharge of their duties, countersign the judge’s awards and ensure that the prize cards are properly affixed to the prize exhibits and that all classes are judged to prevent any interference during the judging and not allow any exhibitor to be with the judges.

The Society will take all responsible care for exhibits received for exhibition but accepts no responsibility in connection with the exhibits. Every exhibitor who delivers any article, or animal to the Society representatives for exhibition, does so in accordance with these rules.

STEWARDS IN EACH SECTION SHALL:

1. Attend at the time and place notified
2. Receive, classify and place in position all exhibits
3. In no way attempt to influence the Judge’s decision
4. Countersign the Judge’s awards, obtain the prize cards from the Secretary and affix same to the prize exhibits.
5. Remove all exhibitors and other persons from the vicinity of the Judge’s whilst judging
6. Not reveal the name of any exhibitor or repeat Judges remarks
7. Arrange amongst themselves for constant supervision of their sections

* Pavilion Stewards are requested to attend at the close of the show to deliver exhibits to exhibitors or authorised receivers. Stewards are particularly requested to make themselves acquainted with their duties as above, the General Regulations and those concerning the Judges and also to attend early.

RULES FOR EXHIBITORS

1. All entries are to be the bona fide property of the exhibitor and are to be on the ground by the time specified according to the relevant section as per described in the schedule. Displays and stalls which are not considered entries in the different sections are to be on the show grounds by 8.30am.
2. All entries to be in writing, class and section to be plainly stated.
3. The judges may withhold any prize where they consider the exhibits are not up to show form.
4. Decisions of the judges to be final.
5. No exhibitor shall be allowed to remove their entry from the ground before 4.00pm on the day of the show.
6. Stewards shall be appointed by the Committee to accompany the judges in each section.
7. Protests against the awards must be lodged with the Stewards of Sections not later than 6.00pm on the day, accompanied by \$1 to be forfeited if the protest is deemed frivolous.
8. No person other than officials and press representatives to be allowed in the ring with the judge during the competition.
9. The committee reserves the right to call upon any competitors or exhibitor to make a statutory declaration as to the correctness and bona fides of their exhibits.
10. The committee has the right to make any other rules or regulations that they may deem necessary.

The Society shall not be responsible for any accident that may be caused through, or by any exhibitor or exhibit. It shall be a condition that such exhibitor shall hold the Society harmless and indemnify it against any legal proceedings arising from such accident. Whilst exercising all care in receiving and dispatching exhibits, the Society shall not, under any circumstances, be responsible for any loss or incorrect delivery of livestock or any other exhibits of any kind, or for any injury done thereto.

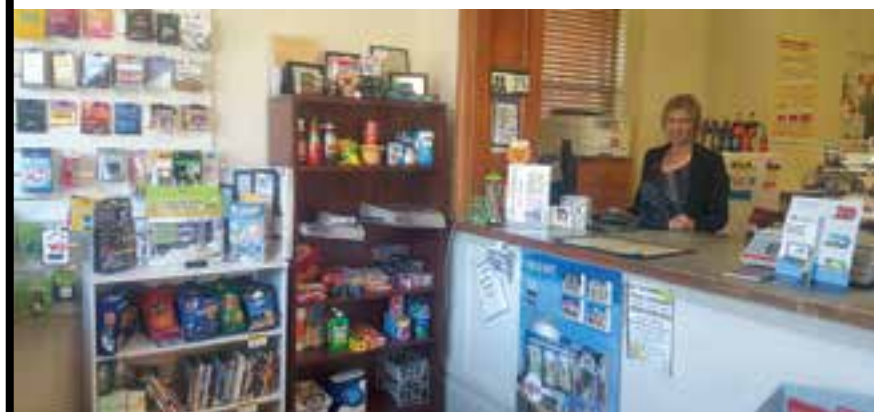

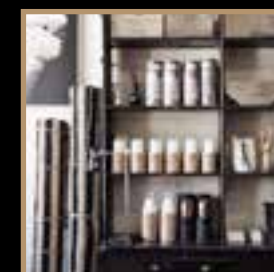

LOCAL RIDER:

FOR THE PURPOSES OF THIS SHOW, A LOCAL RIDER AND HORSE ARE THOSE WHO RESIDE IN THE BLAYNEY SHIRE. MEMBERS OF THE CARCOAR PONY CLUB ARE ELIGIBLE TO RIDE IN LOCAL EVENTS AT THE SHOW. ENTRIES ARE TO BE TAKEN ON THE DAY OF THE SHOW AND EACH COMPETITOR MUST SIGN AN ASC INDEMNITY WAIVER AND BE WEARING A WRISTBAND DESIGNATING SUCH PRIOR TO ENTRY INTO THE RING.

NOTE: PIC (Property Identification Code) Numbers

As from 1/9/2012, people with horses on their property need to apply for a Property Identification Code – this is a biosecurity measure. PICs are assigned to individual properties and allocated by the LLS who maintain the register. You may already have a PIC if you pay your rates to LLS. Every Exhibitor bringing horses to the show will be required to list each horse being shown, together with their PIC for the property from which it has come on the Waiver Form before competing. ASC Horse Committee.



- Competitors should be standing ringside awaiting their classes.
- Events will only be delayed at the discretion of the appropriate judge.
- Lunch break will be taken at the judge's discretion.
- Any horse or rider deemed dangerous will be asked to leave the ring.
- Drugging of horses will not be tolerated.
- Drug testing may be carried out at this Show.
- Any competitor found to have breached the ASC Disputes and Disciplinary regulations will be investigated by the ASC Disciplinary Committee
- Led Stallions and colts must be exhibited with a bit in their mouths and handled by a responsible person 17 years and over.
- Unruly animals may be asked to leave the ring.
- A horse at this show is either a Show Hack or a Show Hunter - one is not eligible for the other.
- In all breed classes, horses must be registered with the appropriate breed societies and papers MUST be provided if requested, including current proof of membership
- There must be two entries before a Champion ribbon will be awarded or at the judge's discretion
- Every rider is encouraged to wear a safety helmet compliant with the current Australian Standard. Riders under 18 years must wear such a helmet.

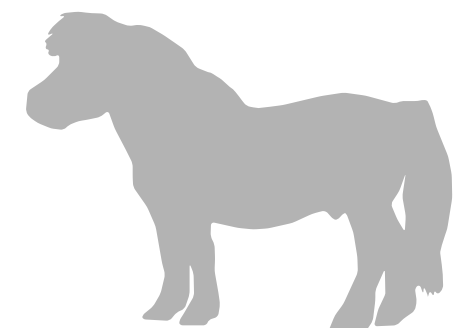

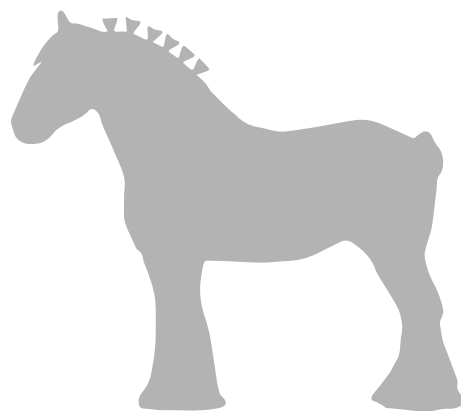

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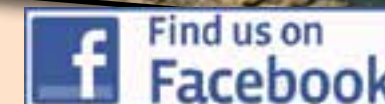

PREP: 1.45 hours **COOK:** 1.30 hours **MAKES:** 20 Servings
(Capable Carcoarian Cooks)

INGREDIENTS

375g unsalted butter, chopped, at room temperature
700g (3 1/4 cups) caster sugar
6 eggs
3 lemons, rind finely grated, juiced (you need 60ml/1/4 cup juice)
450g (3 cups) self-raising flour
225g (1 1/2 cups) plain flour
500ml (2 cups) milk
130g (1 1/2 cups) desiccated coconut
60ml (1/4 cup) elderflower cordial (available at supermarkets)
300g carton double cream
285g (1 cup) lemon curd (available at supermarkets)
Citrus or White Lindt Lindor Balls, to decorate
Icing sugar, to dust
White cachous in assorted sizes, to decorate
Baby's breath flowers, to decorate (optional)

MERINGUE KISSES

2 egg whites, at room temperature
Pinch of cream of tartar
100g (1/2 cup) caster sugar
Yellow icing colour paste, to tint

SWISS MERINGUE BUTTERCREAM

4 egg whites
215g (1 cup) caster sugar
400g unsalted butter, chopped, at room temperature

LEMON DRIZZLE

180g white chocolate, finely chopped
80ml (1/3 cup) thickened cream
Yellow icing colour paste, to tint

METHOD

1. Preheat the oven to 180C/160C fan forced. Grease three round 20cm cake pans and line the base of each with baking paper.
2. Use electric beaters to beat the butter and 645g (3 cups) sugar in a bowl until light and fluffy. Add the eggs 1 at a time, beating well after each addition, until well combined. Beat in the lemon rind. Use a large metal spoon to fold in the flours, milk and coconut until well combined. Divide the mixture evenly among the prepared pans and smooth the surface of each. Bake for 45 minutes or until a skewer inserted into the centres of the cakes comes out clean. Set aside to cool slightly before transferring to wire racks to cool completely.
3. Meanwhile, to make the meringue kisses, reduce the oven temperature to 120C/100C fan forced. Line 2 baking trays with baking paper. Use electric beaters to beat the egg whites and cream of tartar in a clean, dry bowl until firm peaks form. Gradually add the sugar, 1 tbs at a time, beating constantly until the sugar dissolves and the mixture is thick and glossy. Carefully stand a piping bag fitted with a 1.5cm plain nozzle upright in a tall glass. Use a small paintbrush to very lightly paint 4 even stripes of yellow food colouring down the inside length of the bag. Carefully spoon the meringue mixture into the piping bag and pipe small peaks onto the prepared trays (the colours will vary the more you pipe). Bake for 30 minutes or until the meringues are crisp and dry. Turn the oven off and leave the meringues in the oven, with the door closed, to cool completely.



4. Combine 60ml (1/4 cup) lemon juice and the remaining 55g (1/4 cup) caster sugar in a small saucepan over low heat. Stir for 2-3 minutes or until the sugar dissolves. Remove from the heat and stir in the elderflower cordial. Set aside to cool. 5 Use a balloon whisk to whisk the double cream in a bowl until soft peaks form. (Do not overbeat, as the cream can easily curdle.)
5. To assemble the cake, trim the top of each cake to flatten. Place 1 cake layer, cut side down, on a cake board or serving plate. Brush one-third of the elderflower syrup over the top of the cake. Spread with half the whipped cream, then top with half the lemon curd to cover. Top with another layer of cake and brush with half the remaining elderflower syrup. Top with the remaining cream and lemon curd. Brush the cut side of the remaining cake layer with the remaining elderflower syrup and place, cut side down, on top of the cake (the base of the last cake is now the top of the cake).
6. To make the swiss meringue buttercream, combine the egg whites and sugar in a heatproof bowl over a saucepan of simmering water. Use a balloon whisk to stir for 5-8 minutes or until the sugar dissolves and the mixture reaches 70°C on a cook's thermometer. Transfer to a clean bowl. Use electric beaters to beat for 5 minutes or until firm peaks form and the mixture is almost at room temperature. Gradually add the butter, beating well after each addition, until the mixture is thick and smooth.
7. Spoon 1 cup buttercream into a separate bowl and reserve. Spread a thin layer of buttercream over the top and side of the assembled cake. Place in the fridge for 15 minutes or until just firm. Spread the remaining buttercream over the top and side of the cake, allowing some of the side to show through. Place in the fridge to chill.
8. To make the lemon drizzle, place the chocolate and cream in a microwave-safe bowl. Microwave on High, stirring every 30 seconds, for 1-2 minutes or until smooth and combined. Tint with yellow food colouring. Set aside to cool slightly. Pour the lemon drizzle over the top of the cake, using a palette knife to quickly spread it to the edges and allowing it to drizzle down the side of the cake. Place in the fridge or in a cool place for at least 30 minutes to set.
9. Place the reserved buttercream in a piping bag fitted with a 1cm fluted nozzle. Place the Lindt balls on a plate and dust with icing sugar. Decorate the cake with the meringue kisses, Lindt balls, piped stars of buttercream, cachous and flowers, if using.

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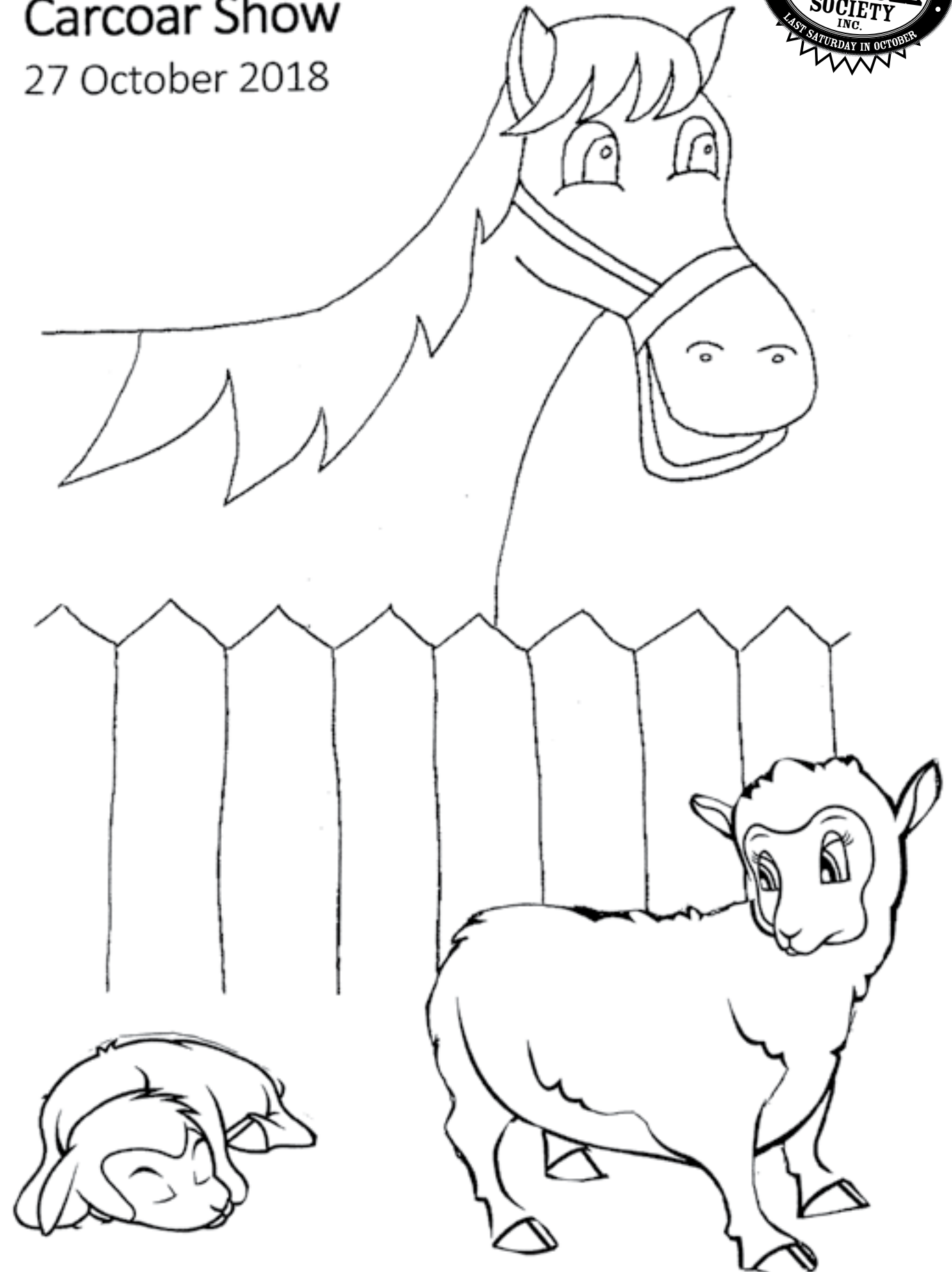

Class 3. Animals - The family dog, working dog, cat, bird or pet lamb, they're all allowed including wild animals and those in the zoo.

Class 4. Rural including Carcoar show - These must evoke some essence of the rural aesthetic. Easily confused with landscapes, the rural section must just yell 'Country life' Think hay bales, stock in a field, harvesters at sunset etc.

Class 5. Man made - It differs from a landscape as the building/object itself is the focus, rather than the building in its place. For this think of old cars, trains, architectural shots of buildings, even some sculptural elements of human design, bridges etc.

Class 6. Nature - this differs from natural landscapes as it includes close up and other natural shapes that nature serves up. Think flower buds, curling fern leaves, rock pools, waterfalls, bunches of flowers etc.

Class 7. Black and White - Chosen from the above categories.

There is no individual black and white category. People can submit B&W images into either of the classes and although we will have a prize for best monochrome, it's not a class of its own.
